




Survey Says...



Seacliff Association Representation on SCCRTC Citizen Committee

The August Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Commission (SCCRTC) meeting reviewed the Draft Structural Assessment Report in their August Meeting. The structures evaluated included bridges, highway overhead structures, culvert structures, and retaining wall structures on the 32-mile rail corridor. This report and the supplemental report of the La Selva Bridge are viewable at www.sccrtc.com. The reports show many millions will be required for necessary upgrades once the rail corridor is purchased. Whether it will be purchased is not sure, but seems likely even though costs to purchase the line, upgrade it, and maintain it for an uncertain use would be excessive.

A County Transit Panel will be formed to craft another transportation tax measure. The last one, Measure J, failed. The committee now consists of over 75 people/organizations that include several bike advocate group representatives and now a Rio Del Mar Improvement Association representative along with a representative from our Seacliff Improvement Association. It is important that we have a voice on this committee, as we may be able to help direct this committee to come up with reasonable solutions that will benefit Seacliff.

Helping Hands for Seniors

Do you or a neighbor need something in or around your home repaired? Help is just a phone call away from the program Helping Hands that provides



minor home repairs to low-income senior homeowners. The work is done free of charge by volunteers. The repairs solve problems that might otherwise cause injuries or accidents.

Some of these repairs include installing handrails in showers and tubs, repairing broken steps and handrails, repair of leaking faucets and toilets, replacing light switches and installing door locks. Helping Hands also provides smoke alarms free of charge. Volunteers cannot provide major repairs such as roof work or any job requiring a permit.

This program is for low-income senior homeowners who have a home repair issue that might be a threat to their health or safety. Individuals 60 years and older who own their own homes and cannot afford to hire professional help may qualify. To volunteer or make a request




