## **CERT TRAINING IN SEACLIFF!!!**

Our first CERT members have completed their training!!! What's CERT?? CERT stands for Community Emergency Response Team and the members receive free training from the Aptos/LaSelva Fire Dept. in disaster

preparedness. Our Seacliff CERT team are members of our community trained to assist when a disaster occurs. In the event of a disaster, our professional emergency services (the fire department, police, etc.) will need all of the help they can get and that's what CERT teams provide.

WE NEED YOU!!! We are in need of volunteers to join our CERT team! The training is free and this is a great way to help support your neighbors and our wonderful Seacliff neighborhood. There are no age or physical requirements. Everyone can contribute in an emergency. Even if you don't feel that you wish to join our CERT team, do consider taking the course for your own information. You learn what you can do to be prepared in the event of "The Big One" and what supplies to store "just in case."

## "Visioning Our Park" Draft Master Plan Scheduled for Santa Cruz County Parks Commission Hearing

Remember the hard work you put in with the Parks Planning Staff over the Summer? From a May night of freeflowing, non-judgmental brain-storming through the winnowing process from three alternative park plans to tweaking August's Park Plan?

The Santa Cruz County Parks Commission wants to hear from all of you so that the final approval of the Draft McGregor Park Master Plan is, to quote Mary Poppins, "Practically perfect in every way."

On Monday, September 15, 2008, 7:15 pm, the SC County Parks Commission will hear a SC County Parks Staff Report about the proposed Draft McGregor Park Master Plan. The SC County Parks Staff presentation will include a site map with a report including your comments and suggestions from the August 20th Public Meeting at the Seacliff Highlands Affordable Housing Community Center.

The proposed Draft Master McGregor Park Plan is an "informational item" on the SC County Parks Commission's September 15 Agenda. That is, the Parks Commission will take the Parks' Staff Report and Recommendations and no action that night.

It is expected the SC County Parks Commission will vote October 6 whether or not to recommend approval of the Draft McGregor Park Master Plan to the Santa Cruz County Board of Supervisors.
