





Be prepared to help your family and neighbors in the event of a disaster through the Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT) Program in Seacliff.

Program material includes earthquakes, fires, floods, hazardous incidents and other general lifethreatening situations.

Rancho Del Mar Update

One of the most frequent questions I receive is about the status of the Safeway project. Many in the Seacliff area have expressed concern about the size and scope of the project and what it will mean for local businesses or traffic. Some, however, have reached out in support of upgrades to the complex but everyone seems to agree that local businesses should be protected.

It is important to note that no formal application has been submitted to the County. This means that there is no actual project to review and we don't yet know what the proposed size or design will be. In addition, the role of the Board of Supervisors is smaller in this project than it would be in a new development project. Given that it is an existing use (even if much larger in size) the Board does not have the ability to prevent the project from occurring barring some extreme circumstances.

Meeting regularly with local businesses in the center, Safeway representatives and the Small Business Development Council at Cabrillo College that is acting as a liaison between the two parties, I have emphasized the need to preserve the mix of local businesses, provide a traffic plan that doesn't adversely impact an already impacted traffic area and environmental improvements to the complex.

While it is early on I believe a few things are likely. First, the project will probably happen in some form and it is important for Seacliff residents to actively participate in meetings with Safeway and proactively reach out to the local land use company, Hamilton Swift, to express what you expect to see in the project. Second, I believe the project can be shaped. I think it is fair to expect reasonable local business protections, improved traffic flow, improved environmental impacts,

better ADA accessibility, community design input and more. This should be a community-based project and not simply a project for, of and by Safeway.

Streetscape Hiccups for Seacliff

Progress in the effort to bury overhead utilities in the village stalled last October when AT&T crews were just two weeks from breaking ground. Work is now focused on locating new utility termination points in the public right-of-way near Coates and Seacliff Drives. Once these are set, it could be a short step to rebid the undergrounding construction contract so ground breaking can begin. Any surveyors you may see are probably a sign of progress.

Completion of the undergrounding should open the gate for the long-awaited streetscape project. This beautification and infrastructure improvement project begins at the railroad crossing on State Park Drive and continues through the downtown blocks of Seacliff Village. Last year the association encouraged dialogue between the county and State Parks for the entry into Seacliff State Beach when major differences were discovered in their respective plans. Both State Parks and the County landscape architects are now working together on final traffic and parking options to allow the streetscape plan to move forward.

Park Planners Respond

Late last Fall, several dozen Seacliff residents met with representatives from both the County Department of Public Works, Parks Division and SSA Landscape Architects to offer local suggestions and improvements to the proposed two-phase design for the McGregor Neighborhood Park Master Plan. SSA Landscape Architects created the park's conceptual design from the range of ideas Seacliff residents had shared with park planners during three neighborhood parkvisioning workshops held several years earlier.

Many, if not all, of the park improvements suggested by Seacliff neighbors to Betsey Lynberg, Assistant Public Works Director and to Bob Olson, County Parks Planner, have been incorporated into the park's updated Master Plan.

Plans to build the park have been on the drawing board since 2007, when the county purchased the 1.25-acre site from South County Housing Corporation, the nonprofit developer who has nearly completed building the Canterbury Park housing project adjacent to the park.

The most significant improvement emphasizes pedestrian safety by building a new park-side sidewalk that will connect the corner of Searidge Drive to the Canterbury Drive and McGregor Road intersection. When built, the now vacant 1.25acre lot located at the corner of Searidge Road and McGregor Drive will be Seacliff's first neighborhood playground park. And, if the Development Permit Phase proceeds without any anticipated issues, there could be a ribbon cutting for the new park in 2014.

Senseless Acts of Beauty to Begin in March

Our Senseless Acts of Beauty in Seacliff program kicked-off last year. Our goal is to foster a "tidier" Seacliff Village and its immediate surroundings. We endeavor to keep our downtown free from trash and unkempt foliage, thereby improving the esthetic beauty of our village. One of the big accomplishments last year involved cleaning up the "Triangle" located at the corner of State Park Drive and Center Avenue. This year we will meet on Saturdays, from 9-10am, every 4-6 weeks and all are welcome. An email invitation is sent out 2 weeks in advance of a cleanup to all association members. Our next cleanup is coming up so please join us. Let's work together to improve our village!


Getting a Jump on the Weeds
