
Ellen Pirie provided an update on County developments. Her informative talk was followed by delicious refreshments and some neighborly get-acquainted time. After that break, Rick Stocker discussed the creation of SNAP and future plans for the new park site. Next, the prospective downtown Seacliff developer Doron Fishbin showed us architectural drawings for his proposed Boutique Hotel/Spa/Restaurant at the commercial end of North Ave.

#### PG&E to Fund Utilities Undergrounding Design in downtown Seacliff Village! Recent

good news in the form of a letter from PG&E advises that in response to our letter of January 15, 2007, their program and project management personnel met to discuss the Seacliff project. One outcome of the meeting

was that, due to other project delays, funds have become available to initiate the designing of the Seacliff job sometime in the latter half of this year. PG&E estimates 12 mths. will be needed to design the project, obtain Right of Way, etc. Sometime in the later half of 2008 they expect construction to begin!

Work continues with the Seacliff Undergrounding Committee to come up with a cost estimate to underground the entire neighborhood! We hope to have a complete report in the summer newsletter!

## McGregor Site Will Be Saved For Planned Townhomes and a Park

As many of you know, Santa Cruz County is under the gun to zone 30 acres of land for high density housing. The State considers 20 units per acre to be high density and believes that if a community has enough land zoned for high density housing, the housing will be affordable. Unfortunately, that doesn't work in Seacliff or any other Santa Cruz community.

In an effort to distribute these re-zonings throughout the county, the Board of Supervisors required the Planning Department to propose Aptos area acreage for this high density zoning and the Department complied by suggesting among two other sites, the 1.7 acre site at McGregor and Searidge. That parcel had already been zoned by the County for affordable ownership townhomes, at about 12 units or buildings to the acre, to be built by South County Housing. The Seacliff community had earlier worked with the County to zone this parcel for affordable ownership housing, in exchange for the 1.25 acre neighborhood park

With help from Seacliff Improvement Association neighbors (Terry Winston, Kate Minot, Ramona Daniels, and Dave Boggini) and other local community members, I was able to per-

suade the Board that re-zoning land that was already slated for affordable housing didn't make much sense. Happily the Board agreed with the previous decision and selected the



approximately six acre Atlee site just north of Temple Beth El.

#### **Coastal Commission Hearing April 11th**

We have one more hurdle to jump before the park portion is officially split from the rest of the parcel. That hurdle is the Coastal Commission ("CC"). Because although the County has split the property off and zoned it for parkland, it is in the Coastal Zone and the CC has to sign off on it. The CC prefers a zoning of Visitor Accommodation (VA) zoning in the Coastal Zone and therefore may object to the change. It will be very important that the staff and Commissioners hear from the community. The hearing before the Coastal Commission is scheduled for April 11th at the Doubletree Hotel in Santa Barbara. #### The History and Potential Future of the Former Par 3 Golf Course

by Funding Chair Suzanne Shynne The former Par 3 was developed by the McFadden family as a 9 hole golf course 1962 and rented to the Menge family in 1977. They continued the operation as a golf course. In 1983 David McFadden sold a portion of the property to Grant Wrathall. McFadden passed away in 1997. In 1999, with the idea of developing the property, Wrathall requested the Menge family cease golfing operations.



Currently there are only two 9-hole courses in the county: the challenging, hilly Casserly's course in Watsonville, and Valley Gardens in Scotts Valley, now up for sale. Because the terrain of the Par 3 is flat, it is the best of the three courses for beginners, the elderly, and the physically challenged.

This 13.7 acre former Par 3 golf course site could fill a county-wide recreational need with its previous usage restored. Santa Cruz Co. is willing to operate the course, using greens fees to off-set maintenance costs, if the property can be purchased. The appraisal determining the parcel's accessed value will be completed in April. Then the fundraising can begin! The goal is to purchase the site without using bond funds. #### Bluff Restoration Off! Takes Upper

The Upper Bluff restoration project is moving along at full speed!

During December and then again in January the California Conservation Corps (CCC), assisted by key volunteers from the SIA, prepared the ¼ acre test plot at the Upper Bluff area of Seacliff State Beach for the planting of California native grasses, plants, and flowers. The area was cleared of invasive plant species and groomed for the introduction of native plants grown for this purpose by the Central Coast Wilds Nursery.

On March 7<sup>th</sup>, the plantings began! The SIA Upper Bluff committee members were assisted by approximately 60 eager first and arms for the and third graders from a local school as well as approximately 30 young adults from



the California Conservation Corps. The first step was for the children to race about the field, burning off excess energy accumulated on the ride over to the park. Then the kids enthusiastically joined the effort by sowing flower seeds and randomly planting tuffs of wild, native grasses and plants. The plants included such varieties as Berklev Sedge, California Oatgrass, Red Fescue, Purple Needle Grass, Creeping Wildrye, the California Blue or Gray Rush, Blue-eyed Grass, the California like a Poppy, the Common Yarrow, Tidy Tips, the California Aster, Lupines, Checker Mallow, Coast Buckwheat, and the Douglas Iris. Many thanks to the teachers and administrators of Main Street elementary school for allowing the use of these accomplished junior gardeners. The CCC has been invaluable throughout this effort and the SIA's heart

-felt thanks go out to all of those fine Corps members. They not only provided strong backs weeding and tilling effort but they patiently tutored the children on proper planting techniques. Thanks go to Park Sector Superintendent Kirk Lingenfelter, Restoration Mgr. Sarah Godfrey, and Maintenance Supervisor Auggie Ceballos.

We were also pleased to have Sue Lispen, the representative from our grant donor, the Monterey Bay Aquarium Conservation Action Fund, join us during the day's activities. Terry Winston, president of the SIA, has prepared a plant identification booklet for the

Upper Bluff Restoration Project. If you would plant identification booklet, at a

The Aptos Service Center is strongly promoting Neighborhood Watch and Business Watch in the Aptos Community. The purpose behind Neighborhood Watch is to "look out for one another and report suspicious activity."

Neighborhood Watch promotes getting to know your neighbor and community through a collaboration process of sharing information with one another to stay better informed.

Neighborhood Watch encourages neighbors to get to know one another and learn what it takes to recognize and report suspicious activity at any time, day or night. To help better educate the public I will be speaking with the Seacliff Improvement Association during the evening of April 11th. During my visit with the association I would like to hear and address the specific concerns of the Seacliff area. I will be applying Neighborhood Watch and Community Policing techniques to deal with the issues. I will also be introducing ways that the Seacliff Association can get Neighborhood Watch off the ground and ensure a successful program.
