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COMMUNITY BEGINS "VISIONING" THE NEW PARK

The Seacliff Highlands Community Center was abuzz the night of May 14 with the happy hum of Seacliff residents enthusiastically planning their first neighborhood park. Mona Daniels began the

General Membership Meeting with a roll-call of SIA Board Members. President Daniels then called for a vote to approve gifting 50% of monies raised at SIA's annual Fleamarket towards building the McGregor site park. The motion passed with a high majority show of hands for approval. Monies earmarked for the McGregor-site Park

will be banked with SHARP, SC County Parks' non-profit account.

Supervisor Ellen Pirie introduced SC County Parks Director, Joe Schultz who quickly turned the evening over to the two SC County Park Planners: Bob Olson and Cristina James. The format was structured around three inventive exercises. Planner James wrote fast and furiously on large pads of poster board set on tripods as residents of all ages gave a shout-out to what activities and personal experiences have been best enjoyed in other parks and are essential for a successful park. High on the list was the emphasis on the phenomenal view of the Bay from the corner of the McGregor park-site and suggestions for introducing a nautical 'cement-ship' theme in the park.

Meeting attendees were given colored dots and asked to roam about, looking at pictures of other parks and amenities such as gazebos, benches, and climbing and play structures and asked to place a dot on whatever pictures were best liked. The exercise is intended to give the planners input in preparing the draft Master Plan alternatives for the next McGregor park-site community meetings.

Save these dates: Parks Director Schultz has scheduled the second and third Park Planning community meetings to be held on July 23 and August 20 at the Seacliff Highlands Community Center. The goal is to have a Master Plan recommendation for the SC Parks Commission by late Fall and approval by the Board of Supervisors before the end of 2008.

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


# **Water Main Replacement for Seacliff**

Have you wondered what all the different color spray paint markings on our streets are all about? No, it is not graffiti. We are getting new, larger water mains. The Soquel Creek Water District has contracted with Pacific Underground Construction (PUC) to install pipelines, fire hydrants, and all related valves and fittings on Broadway, Seacliff Drive (100 and 200 blocks) and El Camino Del Mar as part of their ongoing water main improvement program. This first phase of the Seacliff project began Monday, June 2nd and is scheduled for completion prior to the 4th of July festivities. The entire Seacliff project will continue through December 2008. Construction hours will be 8:00am-
